

A LETTER FROM OUR RECTOR

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Holy Week and Easter is the busiest time of year for clergy, with several liturgies to plan and lead. There are extra sermons to prepare. It can be a tiring time. For me, this year, I feel a bit overwhelmed. Of course, it is an unusual year. In mid-April, Veronica and I are planning to travel to South Sudan to visit the Diocese of lbba. The planning for this trip has been more complicated and convoluted than my previous couple of experiences. Now that we are down to the last couple of weeks before our trip, all the last-minute things are now needing attention - in conjunction with Holy Week and Easter. It brings me a sense of fear that I will miss something! In response, there are the usual sorts of things: don't think about the whole pile, but start with the nearest thing and just get it done, then proceed to the next. I will make use of lists to make sure nothing is forgotten. However, the sense of being overwhelmed doesn't just go away. Oh yeah - we have also got some important home repairs that need attention, too. I just remembered - I have a course to attend the week after I get back. This "remembering" and thinking ahead isn't help-

ing much. So, what to do in the midst of being overwhelmed and being very busy? First of all, don't panic. Actually, that's not true. First of all, pray. It is so easy to be distracted and so overtaken that prayer and devotion (and the whole point of the observance of Holy Week) are set aside and lost. The busier or more demanding things seem to be, the more we need to make time to be with the Lord. I earnestly seek the presence and guidance of the Holy Spirit, and trust that He will "show up" in our worship and in the preparation. While it is true that this week brings extra work, it is also true that my preparations for the various sermons began a couple of weeks ago. They all remain incomplete until they are presented, but the background is underway. Still, these times remind me of my need to rely on God. It is His grace that provides the wisdom and direction we need. Our preparations for travel are similar. For a while, we wondered if we would be able to travel, as there were so many obstacles and seemingly unanswerable questions. We brought these before the Lord in prayer. We also asked others to pray. It was when we shared the obstacle and sought

others' prayers that the answers suddenly came available. That has been true for flights, for vaccinations, for visas, and for coordination at the other end. There are always going to be times when many things seem to organize against us at once, and we feel overwhelmed. These are the moments to come to the Lord in honest and earnest prayer. It's also a moment to share our need with our fellow believers, and seek their prayers and support. God is faithful and we will see the other side of our difficulties.



The ECW has partnered with St. Paul's Missionary Baptist Church to assist with their Food Pantry Ministry. The food is distributed on the last Thursday of the month and organized the day before from 10AM to noon. On

To be sure, cereal, vegetables, canned fruit and meats are always in demand. Our volunteers look forward to assisting with this great need in our community.
