

A LETTER FROM OUR RECTOR

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

The last couple of months have seen an increasing sense of anticipation and gratitude in all that's going on in the parish. Most of you will hopefully have heard of the plan to reorganize the nave of the church. We plan to move the organ towards the front of the nave, right in front of the pulpit. The audio and live-stream equipment is to be moved to the rear of the nave. We are considering types of seating, but anticipate being able to add between 20 and 30 spots once everything is rearranged. At the same time, we are hoping to update the lighting in the area with the low ceiling. Last year, for the first time, we held a dinner for those who were new to the congregation both to welcome you and also to share more about the life of the congregation. We know that it is time to do that again, and there are some preliminary conversations happening to begin planning. We are about to have our fourth children/youth service (first Wednesday of the month). Out of that, we have begun talking about growing our capacity in terms of Sunday School and the development of youth ministry. To this end, I've asked you to pray for God's leading and

provision of appropriate leadership for that ministry. We don't want to simply find someone to "fill a need", but to seek out the people the Lord would use to best shepherd what He is doing. This, of course, brings us to the real cause for rejoicing. We are so delighted to have the growth in the congregation. This is the Lord's doing. Anything and everything we do must be in accord with the "Why" of our existence. We have a mission that defines and drives not only what we do, but also how we do it. Jesus told us (Matthew 28) to make disciples of all nations, to baptize and to teach people what He taught. All our programs, liturgies, courses, ministry groups, building plans and dreams all serve this purpose. We are all about being agents of God's grace. We serve an AWESOME God. He transforms lives, He heals, He delivers, He gives hope, He pours out His love, the Holy Spirit fills His people, and He saves us. We are now in the season of Easter, celebrating Jesus' resurrection and triumph over sin, death, and the devil. These are not merely concepts or memories, but are the realities of our own lives. God is doing great things among us right now. We rejoice in that.

We also need to be very mindful to also be discerning - seeking His direction in cooperating with Him and to grow together with Him and in Him. Every one of us in this congregation has a share in what God is doing and is going to do. Please keep praying for the grace of God to be at work among us. Please keep praying for the Holy Spirit to use us to reveal God's grace and mercy through us. Please keep praying that we will be the kind of family and community He wants us to be. Each of us has a place and purpose in this great adventure now unfolding. To Him be all the glory and praise!

APNET HELPS ST. FRANCIS CELEBRATE 30 YEARS

St. Francis will celebrate its 30th Anniversary on Saturday, May 18th. The Rt. Rev. Dr. George R. Sumner will officiate an 11AM service, with a brief program and lunch to follow. All APNET congregations are invited to participate in the celebration. Organizers would appreciate an RSVP no later than May 3rd to prepare.

St. Francis will also host the APNET quarterly bible study on April 27th. The studies

Woods, conducted the first service. There were at least 30 in attendance with an average attendance that year of 20-23 people according to a report by the late Jim Herlocker, a charter member and treasurer at the time.
