



A LETTER FROM OUR RECTOR

Dear Brothers and Sisters.



Payot

This is the Zandi word for the structure in the photo(s). There was one of these at each of the parishes we visited in South Sudan and there was also one in the middle of the compound where the bishop stays in Ibba. When we arrived for any of our stops, the first thing we did was go to the payot. We were seated in places of honor along with Bishop Kamani and Mama Agnes. The local priest would greet us and lead us in prayer. We would hear from any other community leaders. The bishop would greet the people there and introduce us, whereupon we would give our greetings. At this point we sometimes shared

a meal or toured the rest of the parish buildings. The payot is a significant building in the life of the community. No one lives in it. Its purpose is to provide a place to greet one another, especially guests, and to talk in relative comfort and shade. There was almost always a group of people around the payot who were not part of the delegation who met inside. We ALWAYS took time to greet each person, shaking hands in the Zandi way. Community is important in Ibba, and provision is made to maintain it. Relationships have priority and this dictates the ways meetings and events transpire. While I have no experience of what that is like outside the church commu-

nity, it is such a beautiful thing to experience and pervades the culture and day. This was not something "put on" for us and we observed this as people always greeted one another with joy and smiles. Some of this is obviously an expression of the local culture. However, it is undoubtedly also deeply affected by the faith and love of the people. They genuinely love God and one another and always make a point to show it. This is something we also noted about St. Dunstan at our very first experience - a sincere sense of community. This is something to treasure and grow. Being a Christian is by its nature a community. To be healthy Christians, we need to be a healthy, devout, and gracious community.

APNET continues to grow and offer a greater array of programs for our Northeast congregations. From the celebrated Easter Vigil held at St. Philip's, Festival of Lessons & Carols at St. Wm. Laud, Intercessory Prayer Group, quarterly Bible studies and special events such as the conference featuring International speakers (at left), who shared their experiences on the gifts of the Holy Spirit, "To Each is Given", APNET has proven to bind and bless each of our participating churches.

Since 2019, there have been over 25 confirmations/reaffirmations in our APNET congregations.

SPACE FOR PRAYER

For those seeking a more personal space to talk to and listen to God, the chapel at St. Dunstan is open for prayers during regular office hours and on Sundays. Prayer in the Courtyard is always encouraged at any time. In the oppressive heat of Texas summers, retreating to a cooler option leaves the Nave or the Chapel.

An effort is underway to provide a more inviting space for personal

reflection and devotional time at the rear of the chapel. If unfamiliar with the Chapel location, (traversing from the Nave going toward the Parish Hall), it is the first door to the right after the library.

Each year, the Chapel remains open throughout the night following Maundy Thursday service.

During COVID times, the chapel became the streaming location while attendance was limited to six.

The chapel is an excellent size for small group or individual reflection and devotional time.

Blank cards will be available for those requesting prayers by the Daughters of the King (DOK). In addition to blank prayer request slips, a prayer box with bible scriptures will be placed on the bookshelf.

Prayer is powerful. You are encouraged to spend time in prayer and watch God work in your life. †
